Her research focuses on equality in educational communities and her research interests also include power and agency especially in early childhood education. For example, she has explored agency and career choices of adults, focusing on how gendered practices impact the construction of agency. Her methodological interests are narrative inquiry and memory-work method. Recently she has explored how gendered touch practices emerge in early childhood educators' discourses. She has also been active in developing ECE practicum in projects.
